NH DHHS COVID-19 Update – September 4, 2020

Concord, NH – The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has issued the following update on the new coronavirus, COVID-19.

On Friday, September 4, 2020, DHHS announced 23 new positive test results for COVID-19. There have now been 7,368 cases of COVID-19 diagnosed in New Hampshire. Several cases are still under investigation. Additional information from ongoing investigations will be incorporated into future COVID-19 updates. Of those with complete information, there is one individual under the age of 18 and the rest are adults with 65% being female and 35% being male. The new cases reside in Rockingham (8), Strafford (5), Hillsborough County other than Manchester and Nashua (3), Carroll (1), Cheshire (1), and Grafton (1), counties, and in the cities of Manchester (3) and Nashua (1).

One new hospitalized case was identified for a total of 716 (10%) of 7,368 cases. Five of the new cases had no identified risk factors. Community-based transmission continues to occur in the State and has been identified in all counties. Of those with complete risk information, most of the cases have either had close contact with a person with a confirmed COVID-19 diagnosis or have recently traveled.



