an organic, permanent, brain-based disability resulting from prenatal alcohol exposure.

FASD often goes undiagnosed and can have

lifelong implications: Substance misuse,
mental health problems, and involvement with
law enforcement are secondary disabilities
that may occur later in life.

Participants will learn behaviors of FASD over the lifespan and come away with tools to provide informed care and services in a non-biased manner.
