What is Community Mitigation?

Community mitigation is a package of actions that don't involve medicines or vaccines and are important for stopping the spread of COVID-19:

- 1. Staying home
- 2. Keeping a safe distance of at least 6 feet from others
- 3. Moving to remote learning for schools
- 4. Encouraging tele-work for businesses
- 5. Cancelling mass gatherings
- Closing non-essential businesses




Goals of Community Mitigation

- 1. Slow how fast the epidemic is spreading
- Spread out when people get sick (delay the peak)
- 3. Reduce the overall number of patients
- Decrease deaths
- 5. Prevent overwhelming our healthcare system





Days Since First Case




We Can Decreased Hospitalizations




Days Since First Case
